



TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT



**September 5,
2023**

ADMINISTRATION:

- Town Offices will be closed Monday, September 4, 2023 in observance of the Labor Day holiday.
- Town Administrator (TA) Johnson plans to use Personal Time Off (PTO) for vacation on Friday, October 6, 2023.
- TA Johnson attended the opening day for the teachers and staff of Maynard Public Schools on August 28, 2023.
- TA Johnson is planning to attend the monthly meeting of the Massachusetts Municipal Manager Association (MMMA) on Thursday, September 14, 2023.
- TA Johnson and Assistant Town Administrator (ATA) Stephanie Duggan are conducting regular collective bargaining agreement negotiations with NEPBA Police unions (Patrolmen and Superior Officers), and with AFSCME Clerical Union. Individual personnel employment agreements to be negotiated include: Police Chief; Deputy Police Chief; and, Planning Director.
- TA Johnson and ATA Duggan are conducting recruiting and hiring procedures for a new Executive Director of Municipal Services (EDOMS).
- Health Director Ivan Kwagala is partnering with the Town of Concord's staff to recruit and hire a shared public health nurse.
- ATA Duggan and Town Accountant Kevin Petersen partnered in hiring procedures for a new Assistant Town Accountant.
- TA Johnson is partnering with Town Accountant Kevin Petersen in pursuit of consulting and contracted administrative support for the Town Accountant's Office during the personnel transition of that office

and conduct of end of year reporting, including “Schedule A” reporting to the Department of Revenue and working with the Business Office of the Maynard Public School District.

- Chief Assessor Rick Ladd is working to support a potential taxation methodology for the proposed solar array installation at the Maynard High School roof and carport. Taxes may be considered by the selected solar array installation and management firm, Solect, in their negotiated conditions for a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with the town.
- Treasurer/Collector Jenn Welch is pursuing implementation for electronic pay stubs for town employees.
- TA Johnson attended a recent meeting of the Finance Committee and Budget Sub Committee to present considerations for the Fiscal Year 2024 General Fund budget amendments and initial FY25 General Fund budget projections.
- The town’s [new website](#) allows for residents to create a log in and register to receive notifications, alerts, and other information relative to their interests. Committee members can also request “Author” permissions to edit their specific body’s webpage to be published by a town staff “Administrator”.
- The crosswalk painting project on Summer Street abutting the Fine Arts Theatre is complete! Great work by all volunteers, town officials, and community supporters! A special thanks to resident Andy Moerlein for his leadership, resolve, and enthusiasm!



- TA Johnson is conducting procurement procedures for multiple leasing agreements for portions of 61-63 Summer Street. TA Johnson is also drafting procurement procedures for soliciting proposals from potential vendors to administer the Municipal Vulnerability Program (MVP) 2.0 grant program.




Book Discussion Groups

Introduction to Induction Cooking with Chef Tom–Sept. 21, 7pm

Induction cooktops are the next generation of electric stovetops. They are more energy efficient, faster, and safer than traditional coil burners and even Halogen cooktops. Many power companies are offering rebates for upgrading to the energy efficient induction cooktop, but there are a few drawbacks as well.

This class will cover the basics of what the induction cooktop is, what pots and pans will and will not work with it, and demonstrate some of the safety features and unique properties of this technology.
