

District 14 Tech Rescue Team Training

On Tuesday, Maynard Fire had the honor of hosting the **District 14 Technical Rescue Team** at our station for a specialized training session. District 14 consists of 23 communities in Middlesex and Worcester counties, working together to share resources and respond to complex, high-risk, low-frequency incidents. In these situations, it's critical that we are always ready.

Our new facility and training mezzanine were put to the test as the team honed their skills in technical rescue operations. You may have noticed fire apparatus from multiple communities around town as firefighters trained together to enhance their skills and teamwork.

Fire Fighter Travis Gross assisted in hosting District 14 training at the Maynard Fire Department, utilizing the facility's training mezzanine.

On March 3rd, we were thrilled to swear in two of our newest firefighters, **FF. Ed Nolan** and **FF. Dave Appleton**. We also had the distinct honor of swearing in and pinning **Captain Primiano** in his new leadership role.



Emergency Management Grant Equipment

Thanks to our Emergency Management Grant, we've been able to acquire much-needed equipment:

- **Pop-up tent:** This will be used for long-term incidents and during fire prevention events.
- **Wildfire helmets:** With the ongoing drought, we anticipate a long brush fire season this year, and these helmets will help ensure our crew is prepared.
- **Gas Meters:** detect natural gas leaks
- **Clocks:** for our Emergency Operating Center

The total grant amount received was **\$3,500**.

The Maynard Book Festival returns!


